

COVID-19 - SAFE WORK PROCEDURES FOR TAXI OPERATORS

- After the passenger(s) leave the vehicle, disinfect door handles, armrests and other areas that are commonly touched, using PHAC guidelines above.

PRE-BOARDING ASSESSMENT OF PASSENGERS

Before you pick up any passenger who your dispatch has not assessed, perform your own assessment. Do not allow the person to board your vehicle without this assessment.

With your doors locked, lower your passenger-side window slightly to allow conversation between you and the potential passenger.

ASK THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS TO DETERMINE WHETHER IT IS SAFE TO TAKE THE PASSENGER.

If the person answers **“yes”** to any of the following questions, **tell them you cannot take them:**

1. Have you travelled outside of the Northwest Territories in the past 14 days?
2. Have you been in contact with anyone who has been outside of the Northwest Territories in the past 14 days?
3. Have you been in contact with someone who has a confirmed case of COVID-19, or who is under investigation for having COVID-19?”
4. Do you have
 - a fever
 - new or worsening cough,
 - shortness of breath
 - a general feeling of unease, or being ‘under the weather’
 - muscle aches
 - fatigue
 - sore throat
 - runny nose
 - headache
 - diarrhea
 - vomiting
 - loss of smell

THE PERSON MUST ANSWER “NO” TO EACH SYMPTOM FOR YOU TO ACCEPT THE FARE.

If all answers to the above questions are “no,” allow the person to board your vehicle into the back seat only.
